

REFRESHER ON THE RULES OF FAST AND ABSTINENCE DURING LENT

- Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics.
 - ALL Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence from meat.
- When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. These norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59.
- The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members from age 14 up.
